BALTIMORE LIBRARY PROJECT BOOK DRIVE RAISES MORE THAN \$11,000

DONATIONS WILL PROVIDE AT LEAST 1,500 BOOKS FOR YEAR 4 SCHOOLS

BALTIMORE (June 2, 2015) – The Harry and Jeanette Weinberg Foundation, one of the largest private foundations in the United States, announced today the final results of the 4th Annual Community Book Drive in support of The Baltimore Elementary and Middle School Library Project (the Library Project).
